Good Samaritan Remediation of Abandoned Hardrock Mines Act

<u>Creating clean water for communities and the environment.</u>

The Good Samaritan Remediation of Abandoned Hardrock Mines Act of 2024 (S.2781/H.R.7779) would enable qualified conservation organizations and state agencies to voluntarily tackle cleanups that improve water quality. Abandoned hardrock mines are a huge environmental liability, but nobody is responsible for these messes...unless someone wants to help fix the problem. Then they could be held legally responsible under the Clean Water Act and CERCLA for pollution they didn't create, stopping remediation projects before they start. This bill is a commonsense solution to this problem.



A NATIONWIDE CRISIS IN OUR OWN BACKYARDS

100,000 – Miles of streams in the U.S. listed as impaired for acidity and heavy metals, the kind of pollution caused by acid mine drainage.

40 percent – Number of headwater streams in the western U.S. that the EPA estimates are contaminated from historical mining activity.

\$2.9 billion – Federal agency spending over 10 years for cleanups in 46 states, only scratching the surface of a \$50+ billion problem.

WHAT WOULD GOOD SAM DO?

- Establish a new EPA pilot program to permit up to 15 low-risk projects.
- Mining is strictly prohibited.
- Provides a "do no harm" conditional liability shield for Good Samaritans.
- Requires public notice, NEPA analysis, comment period, and public hearing.
- Only addresses liability under Clean Water Act and CERCLA.
- Notice and comment for Tribal, local and state governments.
- Projects designed to improve environmental conditions.
- Applicant must have a third-party financial assurance mechanism.
- Anyone who caused or contributed to pollution is <u>not</u> eligible.

WHAT TYPES OF PROJECTS WOULD QUALIFY?

S.2781/H.R.7779 would enable public and private entities to voluntarily tackle cleanups that otherwise wouldn't happen:

- A conservation organization could partner with the Forest Service to create a wetland that treats acid mine drainage leaking into a stream located on public lands.
- State agencies could employ local contractors to clean up abandoned mine sites that are hazards to communities through the installation of a passive water treatment systems.
- A volunteer, non-liable Good Samaritan mining company could help a local watershed group remove contaminated tailings piles eroding into a stream and restore the streamside riparian area.
- A conservation district could leverage grant funding and apply for an investigative sampling permit to quantify baseline conditions and design a project to treat hazardous mine waste.

A Good Samaritan pilot program would encourage qualified volunteers to conduct low-risk cleanups implemented with EPA oversight. This would improve water quality and the environment, protect community health, and help foster a restoration economy.
